



All U.S. ports, percentage of total trade
















CORN EXPORTS BY PORT TOTAL: 19B












CORN EXPORTS BY PORT TOTAL: 9.24B









CHICKEN AND OTHER POULTRY EXPORTS BY PORT TOTAL: 5.4B







CHICKEN AND OTHER POULTRY EXPORTS BY PORT TOTAL: 2.84B








PORK EXPORTS BY PORT TOTAL: 5.44B









REFRIGERATORS, FREEZERS IMPORTS BY PORT TOTAL: 13.8B




STRAWBERRIES, BLUEBERRIES, ETC. IMPORTS BY PORT TOTAL: 5.25B


BEEF, FRESH OR CHILLED IMPORTS BY PORT TOTAL: 2.92B








Imports: Tomatoes, fresh or chilled




TOMATOES, FRESH OR CHILLED IMPORTS BY PORT TOTAL: 1.95B

In Summary

1. Port Laredo benefitted from strong trade with Mexico and reduced imports from China into the Port of Los Angeles and Chicago's O'Hare International Airport.

2. In perishable exports, Port Laredo is strongest in corn, pork and poultry. Mexico replaced China as the top market for U.S. exports of corn and poultry.

3. In perishable imports Port Laredo is strongest in beef and berries, tomatoes and tequila.

It ranks first nationally for berries and tequila.
