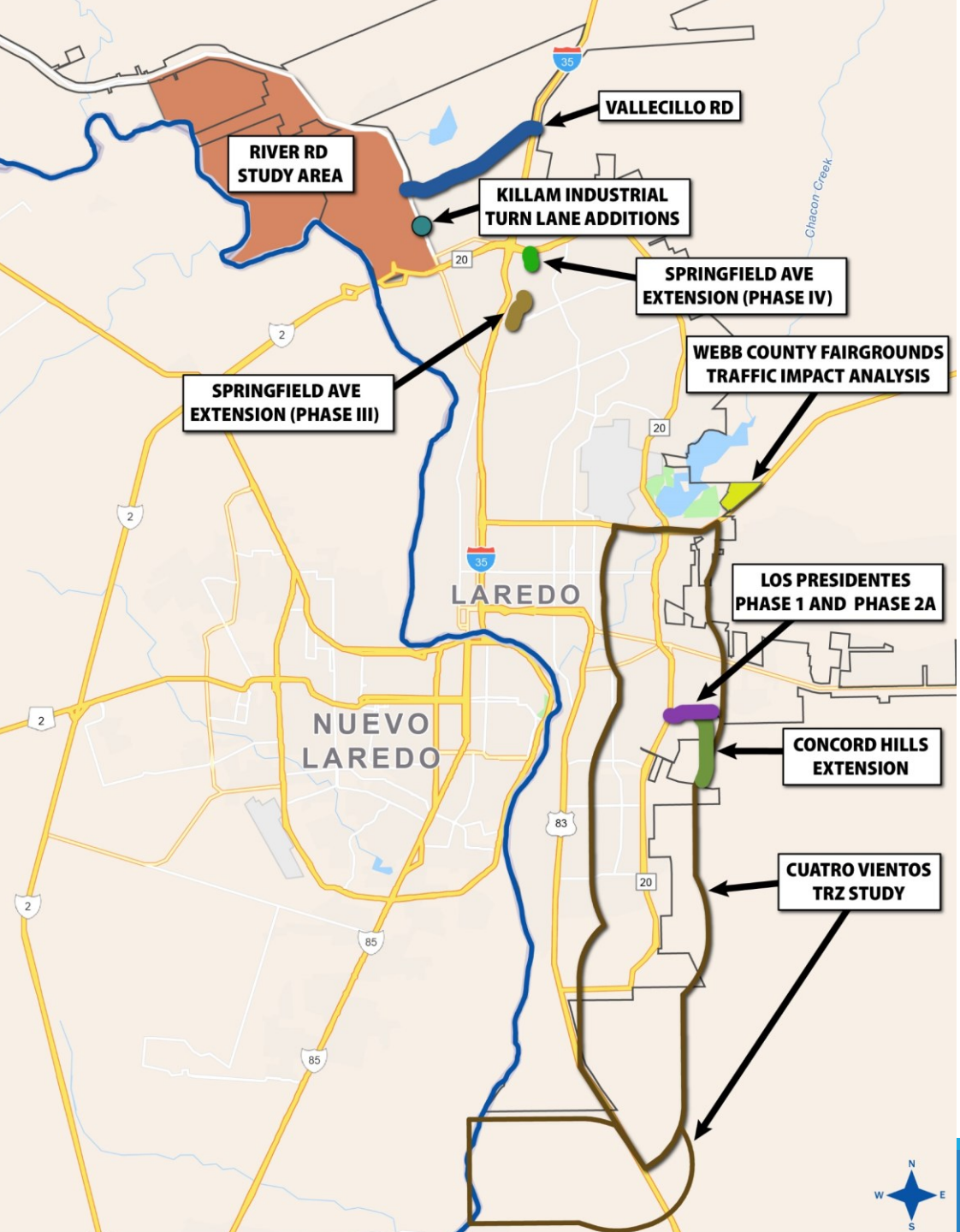

Only RMA in the State that was jointly formed by both a City and a County.



Funding Source: \$10 per Vehicle Registration Fee paid to the County

Chair is appointed by the Governor

Members are appointed by the Laredo City Council &

Webb County Commissioners Court
